In 2013 TV Guide ranked the top cartoon shows of all time. *Rocky and Bullwinkle and Friends* came in at number six. The program first aired in the 1960s and is available still today. It featured Rocky, the Flying Squirrel, and majored in clever plots and groan evoking puns.

One popular program segment carried the title "Mr. Know-It-All". Each week, Rocky's friend, Bullwinkle the Moose (a.k.a. Mr. Know-It-All) would begin to teach the audience a life skill—something like how to catch a bee or how to open a pickle jar. And each week, Mr. Know-It-All's lesson would end up in disaster. As it turns out, Mr. Know-It-All knew practically nothing.

Still today, humility is one of the most godly, yet least sought after, virtues. Richard Baxter, hymn writer and poet, in writing about our eternal home, says:
