"But we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers, about those who are asleep, that you may not grieve as others who do not have hope" (I Thess. 4:13 ESV)

The other people I've been with are just as sad and feel their loss just as much as the first group. Through tears they express words that convey their loss to the preacher and one another. While they also appreciate a preacher being with them, their actions and words convey a quiet confidence that the other group does not have. Their confidence does not depend upon the presence of a preacher. Their confidence is in God and His promises.

It is my prayer that all of us could be a part of this second group of people. It is also my prayer that each of us will live our lives in such a way that those who are left behind can have that quiet confidence that is needed so much during very trying times.
