- 5. Knew when to keep silent—Mt. 27:11-14
- 6. Regarded doing His Father's will as supreme—Jn. 6:38; 8:29; Mt. 26:3-39 Even when in the greatest of distress...the Father's will be done! My desire has to come second—ALWAYS! Jesus said to deny self, but He also lived it Himself. WWJD demands I never, ever compromise what God wants, to have, or do, what I want. Doing the Father's will will have to become like food to you. We must always be acting in the best interest of others...for their good...always. If we love those who love us, what do we do more than most folks? How have we risen above the common sinner?
