BECOMING MORE LIKE JESUS continued Luke 6:40

"A disciple is not above his teacher; but everyone, after he has been fully trained, will be like his teacher." KJV (See previous bulletins for the first 13 ways we can be more like Jesus)

- 14.. Felt sorry for those spiritually lost-Matt. 9:36-38; Luke
- **9:51-56** We must never lose that feeling. It motivates us to reach out to them. We feel for their sin-sick condition and want to help. Jesus showed us how to feel about those wandering in sin...we are to feel sad.
- 15. Ate with sinners-Matt. 9:10-13 Without endorsing their sin, He associated with them. He struck a balance and we must too, if we are walking in His footsteps. We must be careful of evil companionship but at the same time we mix with sinners, so as to let out light shine in the darkness.
- 16. Forgave His enemies even without their having repented-Luke 23:33-34 When they come and repent we have a steadfast command...you will forgive them seven times 70. Endlessly. But what about when they do not? Stephen seemed to pick up on it...Lay not this sin to their charge. Just let the wrong go sometimes is the Christlike thing to do.
- 17. Was not prejudiced-John 4:5-9 The Samaritan woman was no hurdle to Christ. He saw people, not a race, a nationality, a sex, a socio-economic background. And so ought we. He called both a zealot and a tax collector to be in His apostleship. He let women support His ministry. We have to rise above earthly prejudices too if we are going to be more like Jesus.
