BECOMING MORE LIKE JESUS continued Luke 6:40

"A disciple is not above his teacher; but everyone, after he has been fully trained, will be like his teacher." KJV (See previous bulletins for the first 25 ways we can be more like Jesus)

- 26. Violated Religious Traditions of Men, Mk. 7:1-13 There is a place for making waves, purposely! Mk. 3:1-6. When human tradition causes a violation of God's law, that is a good time. Paul did the same thing with circumcision. He refused to have Titus circumcised due to the association with salvation some made of it. Timothy on the other hand, was different.
- 27. **Strongly Denounced Religious Sin, Mt. 23** Not just immorality, but religious sin. He condemned it big time...verses 13-15; 32-33. There is a time to rebuke sin...and of the religious type too. Where did I get that from...Jesus!
- 28. Identified Religious Wrongdoers by Name, Mt. 16:6-12; Rev. 2:6,14 Tact is needed, but so is specificity sometimes. We can be so vague, so beat around the bushes, that the point is never gotten across. Name calling can be counterproductive, but only to a point. Jesus shows that there is a point where identifying by name is helpful.
- 29. Showed Mercy and Forgiveness to Those Immoral... To the thief...today you shall be with Me in Paradise. To the woman caught in adultery...Neither do I condemn you; go and stop sinning. The sinful woman...her sins which are many are forgiven for she loved much. And eating with sinners...the sick need a physician. Jesus was sympathetic to their spiritual plights and condition, more than their religious problems. Without tolerating sin, He showed compassion and drew them to Himself.
- 30. Was Patient with Weak Followers, Jn. 14:8-11 After 3 years, still sooo weak. Peter has chronic foot in mouth disease. Judas is coveting the little bit of money they have and is stealing some of it. All of them are clamoring for positions in the kingdom and touting their own greatness and worth. Yet, He patiently bears with them.
