Have you ever felt like you're just going through the motions? Perhaps at work. You do your job. You do everything that is expected of you. You arrive on time. You smile. Your body is doing all the tasks required, but there is no emotion, no passion, no feeling. So your job becomes mundane, boring.

Or perhaps a sports team whether you play or just enjoy watching. It gets to the end of the regular season and there is no chance of making the playoffs. So what happens? Players still show up. They still train and stretch to avoid injury. But there is no spirit on the field. The players get in their respective positions, and run the designed play. But it's just a body in motion. No joy. No feeling. There are so many games on the schedule so they have to play them all, but the outcome is meaningless. There is no hope.

This can happen in so many areas of our lives—our job, our recreation, our school. What about our church? Are we ever guilty, as Christians, of just going through the motions? We take our seat in the pew, we sing, we pray, we take communion, but there's no emotion, no passion, no feeling—just a body doing what it is expected to do.

In Isaiah 1 the Israelites were going through the motions. They were making sacrifices. They were having their feasts. They were in the temple 'worshipping' not just Jehovah God, but lots of gods. But they had forgotten the real reason for their worship. And God was mad.

In Revelation, John tells of the church in Laodicea. Because they were neither hot nor cold, but lukewarm, God said He would 'spit them out'.

But we worship a god of love. He told the Israelites through Isaiah that His forgiveness was still available. He told those in Laodicea that we can still sit with Him on His throne. We have to put God first all the time. "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your might." Worship with that love.
