A THANKFUL DISPOSITION

In Ephesians 5:20 the Apostle Paul tells us we should be "giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ". In Colossians 2 he tells us we're to be "abounding in thanksgiving". It's almost become cliché to say that we have so much to be thankful for. But we really do. Have you been thankful that gas prices came down 10 cents recently?

Other reasons to be thankful; <u>it's the will of God</u>. I Thessalonians 5:16-18, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you". God wants us to be thankful.

If we're so busy being thankful, we won't have time for "filthiness nor foolish talk nor crude joking, which are out of place". He goes on to say, 'let there be thanksgiving' Eph. 5:4. Look for things to be thankful for and you will find them.

<u>To have inward peace</u>. Colossians 3:15 "And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts...and be thankful". Paul continues a few verses down and says "whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him". Imagine the inward peace that comes from knowing that everything we do, we're doing for Him.

<u>Prayer.</u> Colossians 4:2; Paul writes "Continue steadfastly in prayer, being watchful in it with thanksgiving". The ESV study Bible notes on this verse say "Thanksgiving leavens prayer, so that it does not become merely a selfish pleading to have one's desires fulfilled". It references James 4:1-3 on why we don't receive what we ask for. Pray with thanksgiving. Be thankful in everything. Work on having a thankful disposition and see how much better everything becomes.

Encourage one another in love and good deeds. Hebrews 10:23-24
